2. Once your license information has been received, you will receive a call to verify this transaction and complete the authentication process.
3. Upon completion of the authentication process, you will receive a welcome email and a phone call with your username and password.
4. This username and password are to be used to access the site, and start editing and creating content for RxWiki.com.
